This is an ABGA sanctioned Boer goat show with a full list of percentage and fullblood/purebred classes. Ribbon placings 1 through 5 awarded in all classes.

Entries must be postmarked by September 15, 2010 or double entry fees will apply. **NO REFUNDS after close of entries**; substitutions allowed at no extra fee. No substitutions or additions after 7:30 AM day of show; scratches only. **WE WILL BE ENFORCING THE CLOSE DATE/DOUBLE FEES RULE.**

Please note: Exhibitors who have entered the show by the close date may add goats the day of the show, at the regular fee, with restrictions. No more goats can be entered than what was originally entered, up to a maximum of five, at the regular fee. For example, if you entered three goats, you can enter three more at the regular fee; ten goats entered will allow you five more at the regular fee. Entries over the maximum will be at the double fee. This does not affect substitutions, which are still allowed at no extra fee. Please call the show secretary if you have any questions about this offering.

All goats must be ear tattooed, or scrapie tagged if unregistered, and have current health papers (interstate for those outside NYS); these will be checked at some point after arrival and before show time. All show goats must have registration papers/numbers \*; companion goats must have scrapie tags. Registration papers will be checked at show office when picking up show packet. It is the owner's responsibility for ear tattoos to match registration papers. All goats brought to the show, except companions, must be entered in a class.

- **Kids less than 3 months of age can be shown with a copy of a registration application, stamped with the date received by one of the accepted breed associations. Exhibitors of animals over 3 months of age must have the original registration certificate in hand at the time of the show.**
- **Recognized breed associations are American Boer Goat Association, International Boer Goat Association, and Canadian Boer Goat Association.**

ALL ANIMALS MUST BE HEALTHY. No visible signs of abscesses or other contagious diseases (pinkeye, soremouth, ringworm, etc.) will be allowed. In case of a discrepancy, or for rules not adequately covered, **the show committee decision will be final.**

**All entries MUST be on the grounds by 7:00 a.m. the day of the show. Check-ins are allowed between 10:00 am and 10:00 pm on Friday, September 24, 2010, and 6:00am – 7:00 am on Saturday. No animals are allowed to run free in the aisles; dogs must be leashed.**

Pens will be assigned on a first come, first served basis. These are **spacious 8' x8' square permanent pens**. No reserving of pens. If exhibitors want to pen together, please arrive and check in together. Initial bedding will be provided at 1 ½ bales of shavings per pen; to keep our costs as low as possible, additional shavings can be purchased at \$5.65 per bale.

*If bringing small kids, please also bring boards or low fencing to contain them, as small kids can escape under the bottom rail of the pens.*

**NOTE:** We are adhering to USDSA regulations that no doe who has kidded within one month of the show date will be entered in the show, or allowed at the show. Also, no doe within one month of kidding is to be at the show. This will be enforced.

Scooters, bikes, etc. are to remain out of the show area, photo area, and where the goats are penned.

## Directions to the New York State Fairgrounds

The Empire Expo Center, home of the New York State Fair, is immediately adjacent to Route 690 just West of Syracuse. It is easily accessible from the New York State Thruway (Rt. 90) exit 39 from the West and the East, and from Route 81, North and South. Just follow the signs to the Fairgrounds. For Mapquest, the address is 581 State Fair Blvd., Syracuse, NY 13209.

- **From Buffalo Area (West)**  
Take the New York State Thruway (Rt. 90) East to Exit 39, to Rt. 690 East. Follow fairground signs.
- **From Albany or Utica Area (East)**  
Take the New York State Thruway (Rt. 90) West to Exit 39, to Rt. 690 West. Follow fairground signs.
- **From North or South**  
Take Interstate 81 into Syracuse, to Rt. 690 West. Follow fairground signs.
